Next years will be held on Saturday 1st February 2025.



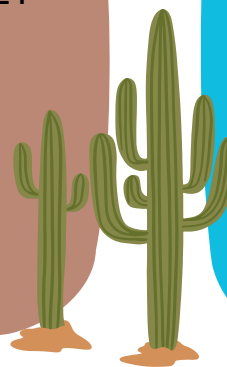

Our Home

KLMTTC (or KLLOC - Kings Langley Light Opera Company as it used to be) was formed in 1948. Below is a picture from a very early production of Iolanthe.



The Community Centre has been our home for rehearsals and performances ever since the first production. Over the years the Centre itself has obviously seen many changes to its structure and facilities. It is a much-valued venue in the village and is used regularly for a wide variety of activities and events ranging from indoor bowls, Gade dog training and keep fit classes to kick boxing and Christening parties.

The hall is managed by the Kings Langley Community Association Management Committee and, post COVID, the Chairman has been none other than our very own Jeremy Taylor. Following his retirement Jeremy took on the post of Chairman and since then the hall has seen many more improvements and changes. Jeremy has formed a team of people who meet every Friday to continually keep on top of all the maintenance required.

We are very lucky to have Jeremy as a member on our committee and he keeps us up to date with what is happening. To date, both the inside and outside have seen many improvements. Inside, the entrance lobby, bar, kitchen, main hall, stage and back hall have all been cleaned, tidied and painted. The under-stage area is currently undergoing a much needed clear out to make it safer and more useable. Jeremy had a new logo for the venue created and it is now displayed on the wall outside. To add a more theatrical feel to our live shows at the Centre it has been agreed that both KLMTTC and KLP can now market the venue as Theatre@The Nap. Also, the back room, which becomes our dressing room, is now called the Green Room. And soon, there will be a street sign put up directing people to Theatre@The Nap.
